The Cal Poly Upward Bound Pre-College Program is an intensive academic program that holds their participants to high standards of behavior, academic persistence and commitment to the program and their personal goals. Participants are expected to maintain at least a 2.0 GPA or higher (according to the most recent progress report, quarter, or semester grades.) Participants must take courses which will prepare them for college while also completing all Upward Bound College Prep Program curriculum. In order to gain maximum benefits from Upward Bound, all scheduled activities are mandatory for program participants. Eligibility for field trips and the Summer Academy is based on your participation and attendance at all UB activities.

To best stay on the path towards reaching each participants goals, participants are responsible for the following:

- Complete academic advising with UB staff, quarterly.
- Turn in monthly grade checks.
- Turn in all required paperwork, within required deadlines.
- Attend all meetings/workshops and events.
- If a participant falls below a 2.0 GPA, they must commit to an action plan that includes bi-weekly advising with UB staff.
- Complete grade level College Prep Program workbooks.



SUMMER ACADEMY

Each summer, Upward Bound offers their students the unique opportunity to have a six-week “college experience” at the Cal Poly San Luis Obispo campus. The entire Summer Program is funded by a federal grant and is at no cost to Upward Bound participants. Students will participate in residential life, campus dining, course work to prepare them for their up-coming year of high school, and extra-curricular activities.

Residential Life and Campus Dining:

Students will live in the Cal Poly dorms with a residential staff consisting of one Resident Director and four Resident Advisors to help students navigate the experience of residence hall living. Students will also get a taste of Campus Dining where they will be provided three meals per day during their stay.

Course Work:

Students will receive instruction from qualified teachers in the areas of math, science, English, and electives. Core classes will provide students a preview of the curriculum they will encounter in their fall high school courses. Enrichment, or elective, classes will expose students to other areas of interest that are designed to increase student preparation for post-secondary success. Evening tutoring hours are provided, with the help of Teaching Assistants specific to each course offered. Students will be assigned to English, math and science appropriate to their grade level and 2 electives according to their particular interests. Classes are held Monday – Friday from 8 am – 5 pm. At the end of the summer program, Upward Bound will host a Project Expo where students will have an opportunity to present classroom projects to their parents and peers.

Extra-Curricular Activities:

During the last week of the summer program, students will participate in an off-campus field trip to visit colleges in the San Francisco Bay area.


Calendar:

Summer Academy Application

Upward Bound will host their 6-week residential Summer Academy from Sunday, June 25th through Thursday, August 4th. Participants will engage in a 5-week rigorous academic program, with a 4-day College Visit trip during week 6. Students will arrive on Monday each week, and return home on Friday afternoons. This year, we are proud to announce that the Cal Poly STEM Department has partnered with Upward Bound in developing and presenting a unique curriculum for our incoming 9th and 10th graders! Our 11th and 12th graders will take part in a concentrated college preparatory series, designed to kick off their college experience. Due to the demanding nature of the curriculum being presented, participants must be able to commit to the entire 6-week experience, to apply. Applications for current Upward Bound participants are due 4/7/2017.

Note: there are only 50 slots available. Students will be notified of their acceptance in May. Students not immediately accepted will have the opportunity to be placed on a waiting list.
